# Prof. Corrado Gratziu

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After the graduation in classical education high school, he gained the laurea degree in Geological Science in November 1961, thesis concerning the petrography of sedimentary rocks (the "Macigno di Piombino").

Research assistant in Mineralogy at the University of Pisa from 1962, in 1969 he held a complementary chair in Petrography of Sedimentary Rocks at the same University. Since that time, till his retirement in 2003, Prof. Gratziu had maintained the course, expanding, during the years, the interests of the didactic development in the subject of Cultural Heritage.

# **QUALIFICATIONS**

- By invitation of the Department of Greek and Roman antiquities at the British Museum he holds a conference entitled Calcium oxalate coatings and colouring on Roman Monuments, which illustrates his discoverieson the genesis of the calcium oxalate "patinas" and their role in the conservation of monuments (25 April 1988).

- He is the author of the item "*Microscope*" in the Treccani Science Encyclopaedia and co-author in the item "*Fresco*" in the Treccani Archaeological Encyclopaedia.

- As member of "NORMAL", commission established by the Italian Ministry of Cultural Heritage, he edits the item "intonaci e malte" (plasters and mortars) for the "Quaderni Normal".

- As one of the twenty-four members of the group of international experts invited to the BritishMuseum in order to evaluate the state of conservation of the marbles of Lord Elgin.International meetings "Cleaning the Parthenon Sculptures - 23° British Museum Classica1 Colloquium (1999).

- As co-opted member of the *Accademia del Mediterraneo*, he has been the consultantfor the Cultural Heritage Conservation.

- In 1999 he is designated as scientific consultant of the Opera Primaziale Pisana for the restoring intervention on the frescoes of the Camposanto Monumentale. The collaboration stopped in 2002 by reason of discordance with the cleaning techniques imposed by the restorer in charge.

- From 2003 to 2004, he was charged of the research activities of the Greek Roman Museum of Alessandria in the frame of Italian-Egyptian collaboration, under the direction of prof. Edda Bresciani of the University ofPisa. He directed the scientific aspects of the restoring intervention on an arch in calcarenite, from Fayum, having some inscriptions of a sacred hymn of the poet Isidorus.

- In 2000-2001,he was encharged by the Directorate General of Projects and Maintenance, (Dwain of Royal Court of Oman) of the study of discolouring of the marble pavement of the RoyalPalace.Hereafter, from 2002 to 2003, in the same frame, he studied the alterations, the consolidation and installation of travertine and marble plates for the square of the Great Mosque in Muscat (Oman).

In May 2009, under the request of the Government, he visits again Omanfor a consultation concerning the marble pavements of the Sunflower Royal Yacht.
